Did you know....


- 90% of a child's brain growth happens before age 5
- If kids start school performing in the bottom quartile, they are highly like to leave school, graduating or not, still in the bottom quartile

- The impact of poverty on the achievement gap emerges by age two
- An affluent five year old often has the same vocabulary level as an adult from poverty
- This is more than just a poverty issue ...


The achievement gap emerges by age two

3.3.3 Share of the Population Age 25 and Over with a BA or Higher




Did you know...

 Most children under age 5 in Chelan and Douglas Counties are not in a formal childcare or preschool setting

 Economists have shown that high quality early childhood programs bring impressive returns on investment to the public: \$4 - \$9 in returns for every dollar

"Every dollar invested in early childhood education produces a 7-10% per annum return in better education, health, social, and economic outcomes."




How are we doing with school school readiness in our area?

- The most recent data on entering kindergarten students in our valley tells us that nearly 50% of our children do not demonstrate early math readiness
- What about reading ?



Dibels Next Kindergarten Beginning September

About 3 out of every 4 children are not ready for Kindergarten



Soft Skills-Social Emotional

Soft Skills include:

- Sociability; ability to get along with others
- Attention
- Self-regulation and persistence
- Self esteem

And there is an increase in:




Pre-K to 3rd Grade: CORE Goals



- Develop strong foundational cognitive skills (literacy/ communication and math).
- 2. Develop social and emotional competence.
- 3. Ensure all students come to school ready to learn.







Summary

- Many of our students are not coming to Kindergarten ready for school – this is not just a poverty issue
- Children who start behind have a difficult time catching up
- Intensive intervention is costly and does not always ensure "catching up"
